



### **Farm-Related Restricted CDL Report**

In our research for Farm-Related Restricted CDLs or Seasonal Ag Restricted CDLs of the 50 states, we found that only 23 states offer the Farm-Related or Seasonal License. The farm-related or seasonal licenses are only issued to farm related industries. Farm related industries are: farm retail outlets and suppliers, agrichemical businesses, custom harvesters and livestock feeders. The seasonal CDL license can only be issued for Class B or C vehicles.

Standard Qualifications for a driver to have a seasonal CDL license according to the FMCSR are as follows:

1. Clean driving record - no loss of license (suspension, revocation, drug or alcohol violations, etc.) for any reason.
2. Must have held a motor vehicle license for one year.
3. One year of driving experience in any vehicle.
4. Medically qualified.
5. Included in a drug/alcohol testing program.
6. Complete Driver Qualification File.

Standard Restrictions for a driver according to the FMCSR:

1. Allowed only within 150 mile radius of farm center.
2. Must be 18 years old. (Exception: 16 years old in Idaho and South Dakota)
3. Limited to operating Group B and C vehicles as described in 49 CFR 383.
4. May not operate a Class A vehicle.
5. No hazardous materials endorsements allowed.
6. No placarded quantities of hazardous materials except for:
  - 1,000 gallons or less of diesel fuel;
  - Liquid fertilizers (including anhydrous ammonia) up to 3,000 gallons or less;
  - Solid fertilizer not transported with organic substances.  
(Exception: No placarded load in South Carolina)
